CONGRESS

The house passed Panama canal government bill, 196 to 161. The house passed the naval appropriation bill carrying \$111,666,000.

The senate passed the naval appropriation bill carrying \$111,666,000. Senator Crawford spoke favoring a constitutional amendment to let terms for superior court judges to ten years.

Unexpected and determined opposition to workmen's compensation bill developed in the senate judiciary committee.

Charges of official misconduct by R. O. Valiente, assistant commissioner, were renewed before the interior department expenditure committee.

In the house, by a vote of 219 to 195 the resolution to let the house require no title be changed without a vote passing through senate was affirmed.

Senator Newlands introduced an amendment to metal alcohol bill a compromise tariff plan to gradually reduce tariff so as to avoid imposing any industry.

The senate judiciary committee reported adversely the Curtis resolution to make the number of presidential electors equal to number of senators and representatives.

The senate finance committee authorized Senator Root to report adversely the house bill regarding revision bill and announce that substitute measure would be framed.

An agreement for a vote on the metal tariff bill next Monday was narrowly missed in the senate as the result of objections by Senator Hayburn of Idaho, following a lively tariff discussion.

The senate Cuban relations committee directed Chairman Page to confer with President Wilson regarding necessary recommendations for legislation in connection with the Platt amendment.

Members of the Nebraska delegation express satisfaction over the prospect of an adjournment before the Chicago convention. Some of them have some important campaigning to do and others prefer the west to Washington humidity in June and July.

Abrogation of the Norris law for holding the organization of the negro race to a political party is claimed by the negroes in Cuba as a basis for their movement, according to state department advisers. The senate passed a resolution instructing the Cuban relations committee to investigate and report on legislation necessary to determine when and how the United States should intervene in Cuba under the Platt amendment.

John Westcott, former territorial governor of the last twenty years, chairman of the national university committee, died. Lawrence L. O'Brien was sentenced at Mexico City to suffer the death penalty for the murder a year ago of Dr. Hall P. Clark, a dentist, by shooting.

NELSON GETS \$100 MONTH PENSION FOR WIDOW OF ADMIRAL SCHLEY.

NEW OCEAN SAFETY BILL

Senate Restores BattleShip Provision to Naval Appropriation Bill Six Dollars to Battle U. S. Senator.
