Something for The Table.

GOLD LOAF CAKE
Cream a quarter of a cupful of butter with half a cupful of sugar, then add the yolks of five eggs, beaten until light-colored. Stir together one cupful of flour, one teaspoonful of baking powder, and add alternately with three table-spoonfuls of milk to the egg mixture, then add one teaspoonful of rose extract, and a few drops of yellow coloring. Bake in a narrow, deep buttered cake pan.

POTATOES PERSILLADE.
Decorative way of cooking potatoes is to peel large potatoes, and with a potato scoop, cut out balls about the size of an olive. Cook them in boiling salted water about ten minutes or until they can be pierced without breaking. Drain, and shake carefully until dry. Pour over them a tablespoonful of melted butter, then when well coated, roll in minced parsley and sprinkle with salt and pepper.

POTATO SOUP.
Wash, Peel and cut three or four potatoes into small pieces and let them soak in cold water for twenty minutes. Put into salted boiling water and cook until very soft. Meanwhile out one pint of milk on in a double-boiler to scald, adding to it a teaspoonful of scoured onion and a stalk of celery. When the potatoes are soft, drain and mash, pour the hot milk on them, season to taste with salt and pepper, rub through a strainer and put on to boil again. Put a table-spoon of butter in a small sauce-pan and when melted add a scant table-spoonful finely chopped parsley and serve hot. If too thick, more hot milk may be added. Serve with crackers or croutons.

OLD FASHIONED SALAD.
A good old-fashioned cabbage salad made of one head each of cabbage and celery. Chop fine together and sprinkle

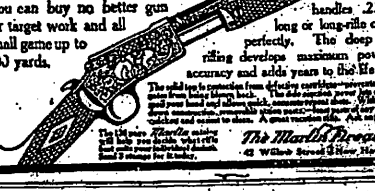

Blend, then add a generous half cupful of cider vinegar, a table-spoonful of sugar, a table-spoonful of mustard, the beaten yolks of two eggs, and lastly three table-spoonful of cream. Cook, stirring constantly until thick and smooth. Add a dash of cayenne, pour over the cabbage, and stand away to get cool. Just before serving add a little whipped cream. 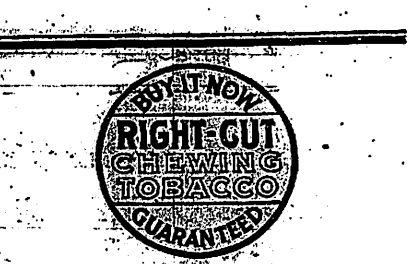
