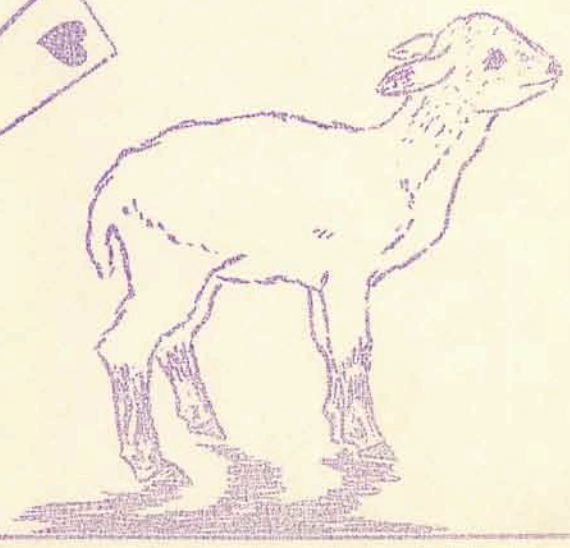

ALMONT HIGH SCHOOL ENTERS 1932 MUSIC FESTIVAL

The Music Festival for Class B and C High Schools in District V will be held in Bismarck, April 18th. The main event of the Festival will be the public program in the evening by the Massed Band and Massed Chorus. As 1200 High School chorus members are registered for the event, the Massed Chorus will consist of about 300 picked voices from almost 20 schools.

The Massed Chorus will be directed by Ernest Van Vlissingen from the Agriculture College at Fargo. Almont High School has been allowed 8 voices in the massed chorus.

The Almont Mixed Chorus has also entered the Festival as a complete chorus and plans to sing two songs: "Hear thou Our Prayer, O Lord," and "Now Let Every Tongue Adore Thee."

The Choral contest will likely be held in the afternoon in the Bismarck Auditorium and visitors are welcome.

Schools taking part in the Festival will include Almont, Ashley, Beulah, Elgin, Fort Yates, Hazelton, Hazen, Hebron Linton, McClusky, Napoleon, New Salem, Riverdale, Steele, Tuttle, Washburn, Wilton, and Wishek.

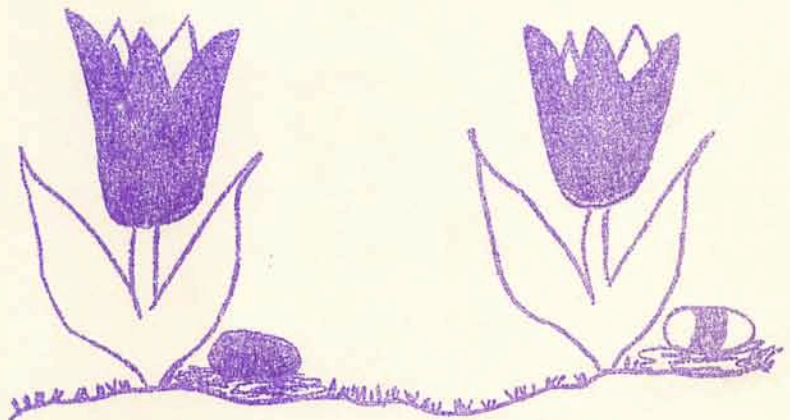
In the Third and Fourth Grades Spelling Contest, the Fourth Grade won by 7/8 of a point.

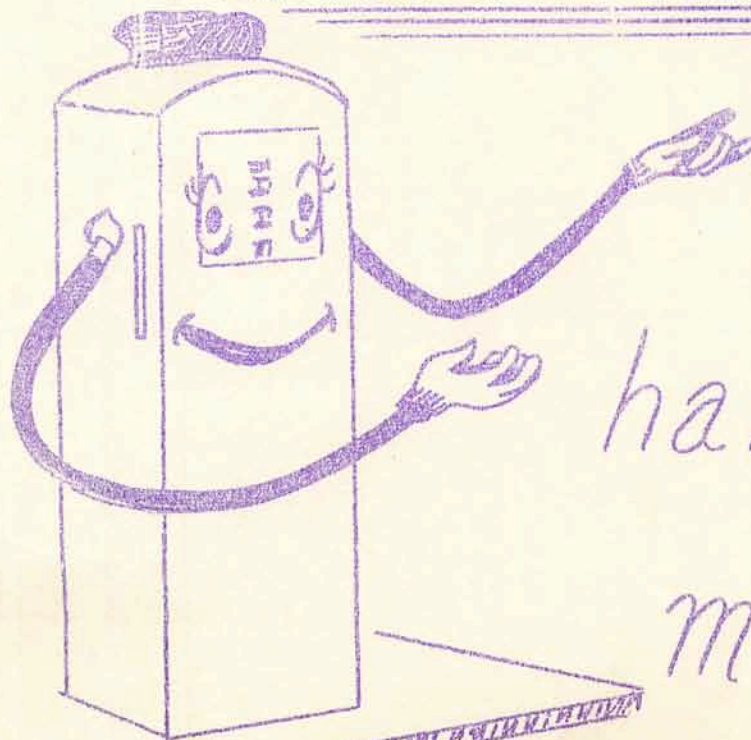

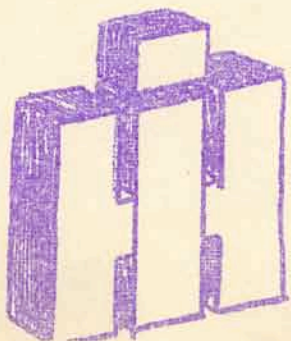

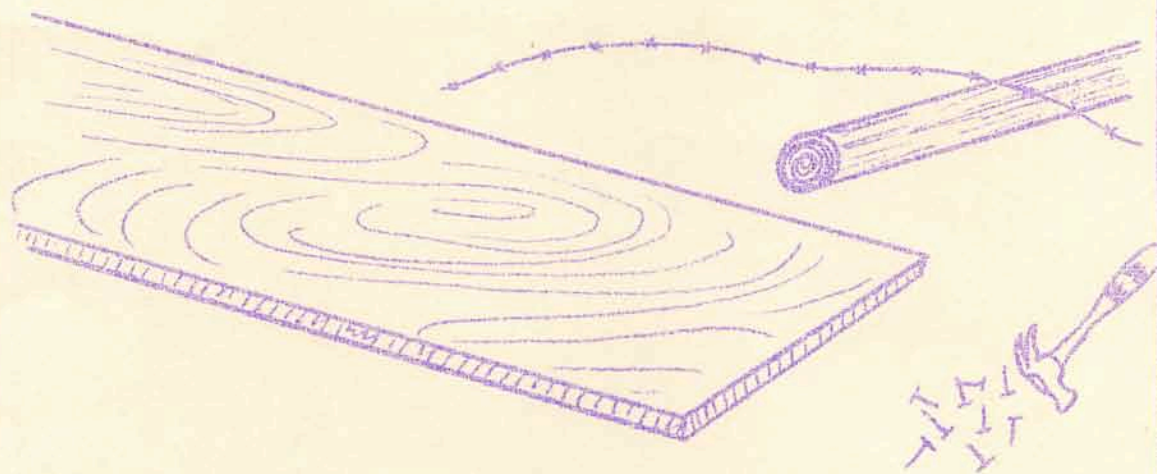
