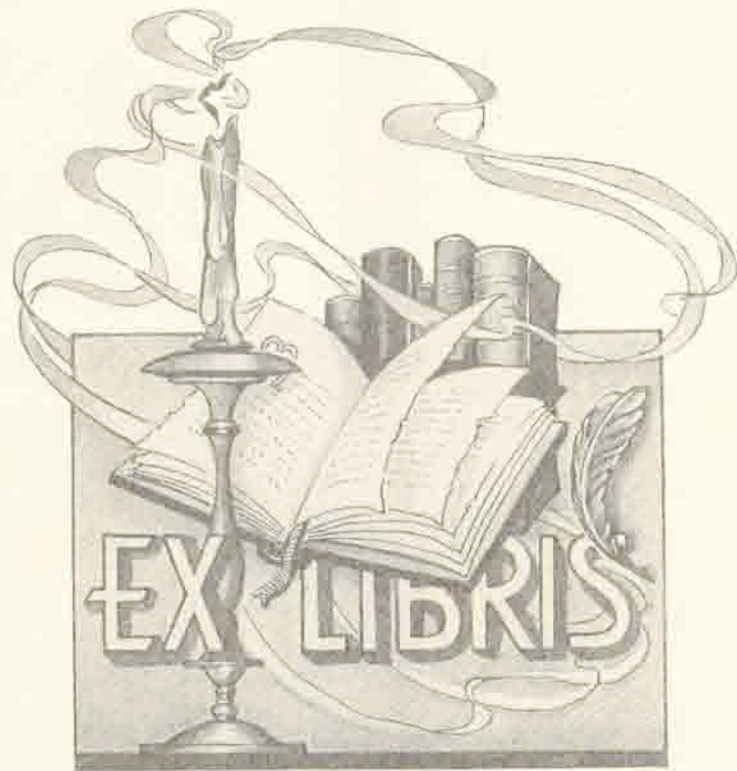
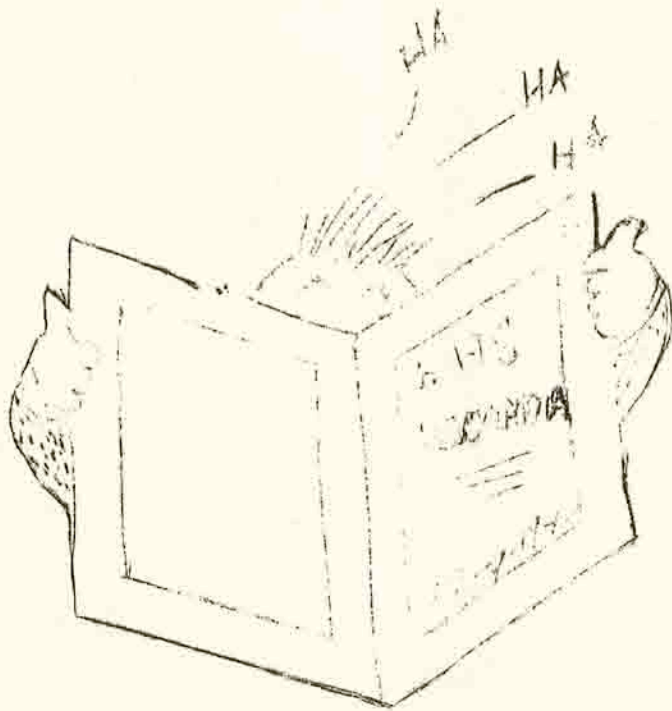


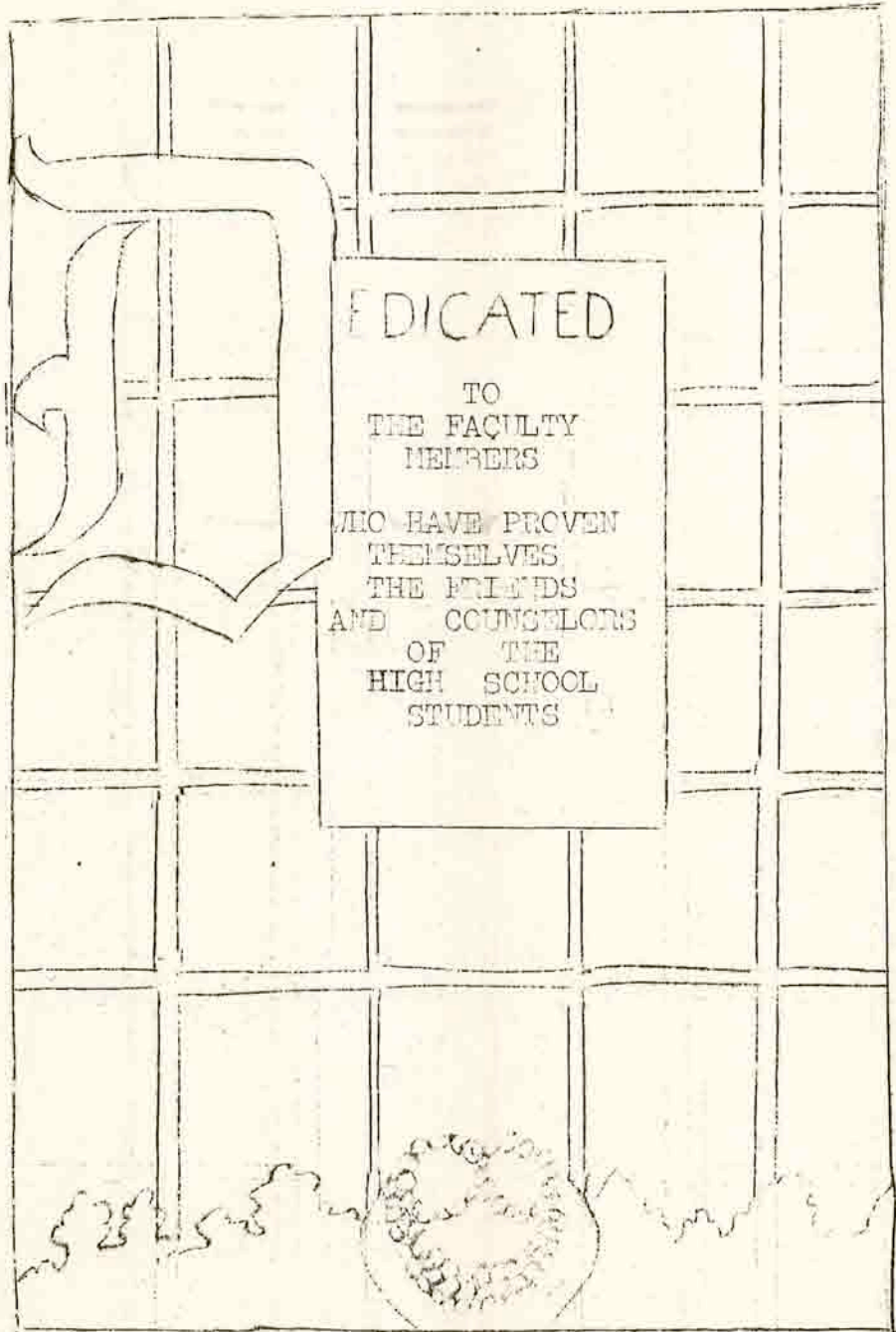

The class officers for our Sophomore year were:- Carol Knutson-President, Helen Hoeger-Vice President; Beatrice Seim- Secretary and Treasurer.

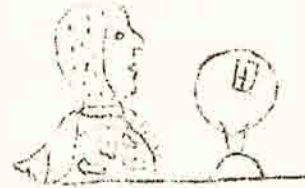
The wheel of fortune spins again and our Junior year begins with Esther Christianson joining us after having completed her Sophomore year at the Glen Ullin High School.

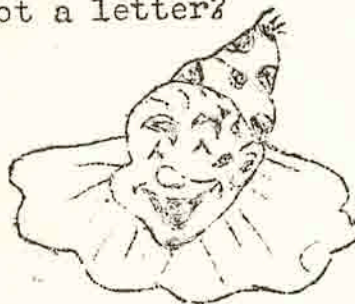

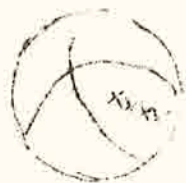

This season the boys played nine games which were very exiting. Almont won four and dropped five of their regular scheduled games.

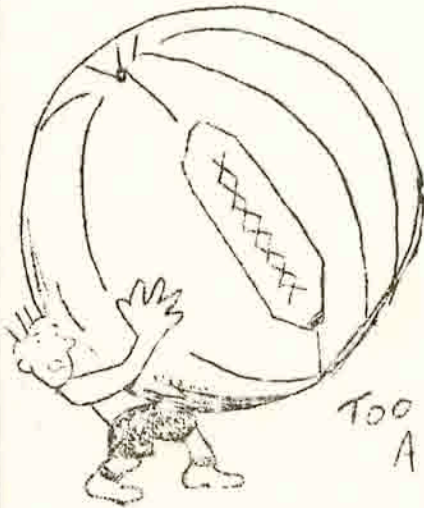
